



BRANDS WE STILL KNOW

In 1931, Adolph Rickenbacher and George Beauchamp founded Ro-Pat-In Corporation (ElectRoPatent-Instruments) to sell electric Hawaiian guitars. Beauchamp was a vaudeville performer who wanted to make his guitar louder. In 1928, he and partners opened the National String Instrument Corporation to make guitars, mandolins, and ukuleles. Rickenbacker ran a metal stamping shop and was a skilled engineer and machinist. His company was hired to make metal bodies for the new instruments.

Disagreements among management led the company to split. Beauchamp experimented at home and, with the help of several others, came up with a prototype electric pickup.

In 1931, a group including Beauchamp and Rickenbacker formed the Ro-Pat-In Corporation (elektRO-PATent-INstruments) to make and sell electrically amplified musical instruments, which were the first solid body electric guitars.

In 1933, the Ro-Pat-In company's name was changed to Electro String Instrument Corporation, and its instruments were labeled simply as "Electro."

In 1934,the name "Rickenbacker" was added. The company's instruments went on to become the favorites of many musicians, especially during the rock and roll years.


ANSWER

While Bugatti was known for integral brake drum wheels, the idea also appeared on GM's 1953 Firebird concept car. But by 1959, the exposed/finned brake drum was being produced by Panhard for it's PL17 sedan. It was surrounded by a five-bolt, open center steel wheel (the spare tire was mounted under the hood....concentrically around the air filter). A so-equipped, Panhard-powered DB (Deutsch-Bonnet) racer won the Index of Performance award at Le Mans in1956. Ford, of course, used an open face wheel design from 1936 to 1939, and VW did, too.... but with a conventional brake drum and hubcap/wheel cover.
