

## **AACA Welcomes the Class of 1998**

As you know, AACA considers any vehicle 25-years-old-or-older an antique. This year, AACA recognizes the Class of 1998 that's crossed that 25-year-old threshold. Here a sampling of some recognized examples that now enjoy antique automobile status and are welcome on AACA show fields across America and around the world:

## 1998 New Volkswagen Beetle

In a nod to its iconic heritage, Volkswagen rolled back the clock and treated automotive enthusiasts to a reimagined 1998 VW Bug in anticipation of the soon to arrive new millennium. The company said that, "A car like this only comes around twice in a lifetime." But they weren't thinking small...this time...with this all-new edition. Built off the Golf, the last one would leave the line in 2019.



## 1998 Mercedes-Benz ML 320

Remembered as the first modern luxury sport utility vehicle, the Mercedes M-Class pioneered the idea of combining off-road prowess with utmost creature comfort, along with refined performance, on-road handling precision and steadfast safety sentiment. It was assembled in a purpose-built plant in Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

#### 1998 Ford Crown Victoria

In 1998, Ford took the opportunity to redesign its mainstream, full-sized four-door sedan for the masses with a more elegant and formal execution. Versions specified for law enforcement were now designated Police Interceptors. Over what would become a fourteen-year lifespan, just under 1 million were manufactured.

## 1998 Toyota Sienna

The then-ever popular minious segment enjoyed the arrival of a new entry from Toyota. Replacing the rear-wheel drive Previa, the front-drive "Camry of miniousns" was designed specifically for the North American market. Now in its fourth generation, the award-winning Toyota Sienna remains with us to this day.

#### 1998 Chevrolet Camaro/Pontiac Firebird

The bowtie brand took its new-for-1997 LS (Luxury Sport) 1 Corvette engine and dropped it into the Camaro for 1998. It was considered "balanced and brutally fast" with a 0-60 mph elapsed time of 5.2 seconds. A sister Pontiac Firebird F-body was also offered.

#### 1998 BMW Z3 M


Likewise in the performance domain, BMW breathed on its Z3 sportscar with factory "M" treatment. Engine and chassis upgrades were calibrated specifically for enthusiasts, and the Z3 M is now considered BMW's last analog sports car.




In 1998, the Stuttgart automaker may have been busy with the groundbreaking ML sport utility, but that didn't stop it from also introducing the SLK sports car. A bit tamer than the BMW Z3 M, it instead distinguished itself by taking a page out of automotive history and reintroducing the retractable hardtop.

#### 1998 Mercedes-Benz CLK

If that weren't enough, Mercedes also launched the CLK sport coupe in 1998 in the U.S. As a company that previously produced primarily four-door sedans, it was intended to be a new expression of rolling sculpture. And succeeded.





#### 1998 Lincoln Navigator

Lincoln entered the full-size, luxury SUV fray with the Navigator, which was built off the Ford Expedition. It was advertised under the headline..."Damn the tuxedos, full speed ahead." Over-the-road serenity has since been its objective.

## 1998 Dodge Ram Quad Cab

Dodge joined the door wars with the lure of more...actually, four...in its full-size pickup truck. The Quad Cab was marketed through an ambitious campaign that promoted, "More power. More torque. More towing. More payload. More room."

Harry Burnett worked for the Hershey Chocolate Company on and off for a period of time. At one point, he started a small candy company. When it eventually failed, he returned to work for Hershey in 1921, managing one of their dairy farms. Money was still tight so Harry began working with candy again. In 1923, he quit his job and opened the H. B. Reese Candy Company. But he actually asked the Hershey Company for permission first, and they agreed with the condition that he buy all his

chocolate from them. The new company started with chocolate covered goodies, then moved on to candy bars, which were successful enough that in 1926, he built a new factory in Hershey. In 1928, the Reese company came up with a new version of peanutbutter balls, making them as cups which were easier to package. The Great Depression almost wiped out the company, but it scraped through intact. The Peanut Butter Cups were a huge hit and eventually the company quit making other candy and focused on just this product.



## HEMMINGS MOTOR NEWS "2023 GREAT RACE" VISITS KANSAS

The 2023 Hemmings Motor News Great Race will have an overnight stop in Wichita Thursday, June 29, 2023. Approximately 120 vehicles will be competing for \$150,000 in prizes. The cars will begin arriving at Riverfront Stadium, in Wichita, starting at 4:45 PM. They will overnight on Mosely Street in Wichita's Old Town District. It is unknown where cars will be on display at Old Town but you can apparently see them come in at the Riverfront Stadium starting at 4:45 PM. Parking will be a problem.

Other places you might see the cars will be Lyon Co. Fairgrounds on June 29th at 1:00 PM for lunch; then Friday, June 30th, lunch at the SRCA Drag Strip at noon; and overnight in Garden City on Main St./Stevens Park, at 5:00 PM.

The event starts in St. Augustine, Fl on June 24th and finishes in Colorado Springs, CO July 2nd. It's to cover 2,300 miles in nine days. Entrants from Australia, Canada, England, Germany, Japan, and numerous locations from the United States will be included. Vehicles dating back to 1916 are competing. The newest car allowed this year is 1974.

The best selling car of all time is the Toyota Corolla, with over 30 million sales since 2009. One Corolla is sold every 40 seconds around the world.

When Volvo invented the modern three-point seatbelt 50 years ago, they made the patent open and free to all car manufacturers. Seat belts now save over 13,000 lives in the US each year.

Electric cars are not new. In fact, in 1900 38% of cars were electric, 40% were steam, and 22% were powered by gasoline.

Although Henry Ford (1863-1947) did not invent the modern car or the assembly line, he was the first to manufacture cars that many middle-class Americans could afford. His introduction of the Model T automobile in 1908 revolutionized transportation and American industry.

The revolutionary 1980 AMC Eagle anticipated the all-wheel drive (AWD) Subaru. The four-door station wagon or sedan was the first crossover utility car made, even if SUV terminology wasn't there yet.

As a sort of mash up between the AMC Gremlin, the Pacer, and the Rebel, the Eagle was the first American car to come with AWD. It also featured a raised chassis.
