

MORE ABOUT DEAN WELLER

Editor note: For those of you who do not know Dean Weller, he was an amazing person, a car guy through and through. Club members in March 2018 had the opportunity to tour Dean Weller's Garage in DeSoto, Kansas. So let's start with a little history about Dean. This story was written by Roscoe Yoder and published in April 2018 Generator:



There are some things you won't see in Grandpa's Old Ford Garage. No metal brake. No English wheel. No CAD program. No corvettes. There is no plastic and not a computer to be found at the 100 year old soot-stained Ford dealership in DeSoto where Dean Weller works his magic.

A retired home builder, Dean is an agile, alert, genial artist, craftsman, and every inch a gentleman. His 92nd birthday was recently celebrated by parachuting down to awaiting friends. Creativity here seems to know no bounds. Case in point: each car built has a detailed, comprehensive, illustrated notebook of its construction, replete with exploded views showing every single part. But no computers, remember? Every illustration is drawn freehand in pen & ink! Even on close inspection these appear to be computer generated. An artist in wood, metal and on paper, Dean is quick to share his love of people and creativity.

A few of the 30+ cars shoe-horned into the building came as is, but most he either restored or built on a Model A frame. There is far too much to absorb in a single visit. Walls, ceilings and beams are a honeycomb of organized chaos--thousands of auto parts awaiting the next project. A 1915 Mercer recreated with neither mold nor model.

Five buggies were custom built for Wiley Post's traveling road show; boat-tail speedsters, open roadsters, all-wood open delivery truck, wooden depot hack, each hand-built and hand-finished.

Last week our own club was privileged to get a peek into Dean Weller's world. We were astounded and delighted. Each left with a smile on our face, a new friend and very, very grateful for being allowed behind the curtain to see how the magic is created. Again, thank you, Dean.

Okay so now you know a bit about Dean Weller, this is one of his most beautiful of art, "America's Sweetheart", a Henry Ford Model A.






This special model vehicle is representative of all 5 million A's built from 1928-1931 and a tribute to all of the Model A's and Henry Ford.

BRANDS WE STILL KNOW

In 1903, James L. Kraft rented a horse and started a business of buying cheese wholesale and selling it locally. Business was good, and soon four of his brothers joined the business. In 1909. thev incorporated the new company as J.L. Kraft & Bros. Co. By 1915, the brothers owned a cheese factory of their own and produced processed cheese in tins. In 1916, the company got a patent for their new production process, and soon started supplying the tinned cheese to the military. In 1927, the company took over the Velveeta Cheese Company. In 1928, they merged with Phenix Cheese to create the Kraft-Phenix Company, and this company supplied almost 40 percent



sold in the US. In 1930, Kraft-Phenix was bought by National Dairy Products Corp, but continued to operate as a separate entity for quite a few more years. The company continued to enjoy success thanks to James Kraft being an innovator at using TV and radio show sponsorships to advertise Kraft products.



Quiz on page 4 Motivated by the State Bank of Saxony (which had widespread financial interests throughout Germany), the then-struggling Horch (founded in 1899), Audi (1910) and DKW (1916) companies were urged to form a cooperative "Saxony Auto Trust Agreement" in 1931. Wanderer (from 1885) was then purchased by the amalgam in 1932 to create what became known as Auto Union, which was symbolized by four equally identifiable, interlocking rings. The iconic logo would ultimately be assumed by what survived as Audi.
