

McPHERSON COLLEGE'S STUDENT RESTORED CAR

Students, faculty and staff at McPherson College are celebrating today after a student-restored car came in second in a prestigious competition.

The school's 1953 Mercedes-Benz 300S Cabriolet took second in the postwar luxury class division at the 72nd Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. Thousands of car owners worldwide tried to get their cars shown at the event, but only 200 were invited to compete, including McPherson College.

This is the first time in the event's history that an entirely student-restored car has made it into the top three in class. McPherson College automotive restoration

students spent the last seven years restoring the Cabriolet.

"Many car collectors dream of just competing at Pebble Beach their entire lives, so for our students to earn second in class is truly an exceptional achievement," McPherson College President Michael Schneider said in a news release. "This is 10 years in the making, with students, alumni, and faculty pouring their heart and soul into this restoration project of the Mercedes-Benz to make this vision a reality. This accomplishment puts our



students on par with the professionals of automotive restoration".

BRANDS WE STILL KNOW

Gabrielle Chanel, famously known as Coco Chanel, and already a famous fashion designer, decided in 1920 it was time for a scent for the "new modern woman." Working with master perfumer Ernest Beaux, who also created scents for the Russian Tsars, Chanel released Chanel No. 5 in 1921. The usual fragrances of the time were soliflores, scents that focused on one flower. Chanel wanted a perfume that was complex; a scent that was crafted

and composed of many components, just like the clothing she designed. It was said that she was "the first to bring together, the woman, the dress, and the perfume." The name Chanel No.5 came from several sources; Chanel thought of the number five as her lucky number. In fact her new design lines were always released on the fifth day of the fifth month. Beaux provided her a number of test fragrances during development; the scent she chose was sample number five. Chanel No. 5 has notes of rose, jasmine. Interesting note: Chanel No.5 is classified as an "unstable" perfume, which means it smells unique on each wearer.



The candidate, parent or grandparent must be an AACA member in good standing for a minimum of five years, and the candidate must be nominated by a region or chapter. The minutes of the meeting where the nomination occurred must be included with the application, along with a copy of the letter of acceptance to the institution they are or will be attending. In addition, a resumé, essay and transcripts are required with the application. (Deadline for application is December 1, 2023).

THE JACQUET AUTOMOBILE

In January of 1920, the Grand Rapids Brass Company was looking to sell its building due to financial troubles. At the same time, the Jacquet group was looking for a place to build their vehicles in hopes of becoming the next Detroit or Flint.

On January 27, 1920, the Jacquet Motor Corporation of America purchased the property with the option to purchase additional property for expansion in the future.



The Jacquet Motor Corporation of America was formed. The name of the company was derived from a combination of Jackson (President) and Marquet (Production and Experimental Manager). The officers of the company had experience in other auto and truck ventures. A. J. Jackson, the President of the company, worked with Republic Truck in Alma. Initial investment was \$100,000 in stock and production started on February 17 with just 5 men. The first vehicle was to be completed March 15 and the first shipment of motors had arrived in May. In early June, Jackson was voted out and L. W. Wilson was put in charge. The company was reorganized with \$30k of stock underwritten by the board. The Belding Banner News featured Jacquet Motors in July, 1920 celebrating the company and hoping there would be big things for Belding.

The factory was ready and suppliers were lined up. Parts were to come from many different manufacturers. Auto painting was also done out of the Jacquet building. The car was to be comparable to a Stutz Bearcat with a similar Wisconsin Engine. It boasted an aluminum body and 82 h.p.

In August another meeting was held, to raise even more money for the company. It is known that at least one car was built before the Labor Day Parade of 1920 as it appeared in the parade and was shown around the grounds of the Ionia fair. A possible second car was built and 4 to 5 were in various states of assembly when the company went under, according to records.

The company continued in November and December to raise money. Finally on December 22, Jacquet officially announced it had "temporarily sidelined car production" to manufacture the B. J. Steam Gas Generator. By March 1921, the company was producing the Little Giant cement mixer.

August of 1921 was the end of the car building business for the company. The car was given away through a raffle and the winner George "Leo" Bowler, eventually sold it. The whereabouts of this vehicle, a second possible vehicle, and the possible 4 or 5 partially assembled vehicles is unknown.





